

Sci-Tech

'Two Rum Affairs and the Nature of Scientific Fraud'

On March 15th, Roger Reeves who was a member of a biogeochemical research group that visited the Scottish Island of Rum in 1992, talked about his work there.

He also told a gripping, edge-of-your-seat story about a famous botanist defrauding the world for many years, with false claims of discovering certain species of plants on Rum, and how some furtive science sleuths investigated it. The botanist wasn't exposed because of fear of damage to his reputation, that of his son (also a scientist), and of science generally. In 1998 a book was published about the fraud which had been exposed in 1948 but then kept secret for the next 50 years. Roger's presentation dealt briefly with his 1992 work (**not** fraudulent!) and he then went on to explain the nature of the early '90s fraud, the probable reasons for it, its exposure

and cover up and some of the driving forces behind scientific fraud generally. He used the Piltdown Man fraud case as another example.
